Detectives with the Kernersville Police Department need your help with the following cases:

Homicide-Victim: Kathi Goff Kennedy

On Monday, October 17, 1994 around 7 p.m., Kathi Goff Kennedy was last seen alive. The next day when she did not hear from her daughter, the victim's mother went to the Springbrook Apartment Complex. After knocking, she entered the apartment to find her daughter dead.



Mrs. Kennedy had been beaten and stabbed multiple times. Found inside the home were her two daughters, ages 4 and 18 months. The children were unharmed. The victim's husband was out of town and is not considered a suspect. The victim and her family had lived in the apartment complex for only three weeks.

There is a \$5,000 REWARD for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the murder of Kathi Goff Kennedy, 35-year-old mother of two small children in Kernersville.

Larceny of Bobcat



In February of 2011 a white Bobcat 751 was stolen from Farmer's Feed and Seed. The suspect was driving a 2500 full size pick-up truck, possibly a Dodge. The suspect was pulling a tandem axle trailer which appeared to have a burned out left taillight (picture is not of the actual stolen Bobcat).

Breaking & Entering at Sports Center

On March 16th 2011 two unknown subjects forced entry to the Sports Center Athletic Club through a side window. Nine 42 inch Samsung flat screen televisions and 1 50 inch Samsung flat screen television were stolen. The suspects appeared to be Caucasian or light skinned Hispanic.

Armed Robberies

In February of 2011, The Pop Shoppe on Union Cross Road and the Fast Track on Clayton Forest Drive were robbed at gun point within 4 days of each other. The suspect is a black male, approximately 6'00" tall wearing black gloves, a black hooded sweatshirt and a black ski mask covering the lower part of his face. The subject approached on foot and left on foot.

Larceny at FedEx Construction Site

During January 2010 cargo containers at the FedEx construction site were broken into and several thousands of dollars worth of tools were stolen. Types of the stolen tools include: generators, saws, wrenches, grinders, drills, laser levels and miscellaneous power tools.

Larceny of Copper from Hospital Construction Site

During December of 2009 on several different occasions copper pipe was stolen from the Forsyth Hospital Construction Site. The copper pipe was taken off of rolling storage shelves on one occasion. It was taken from the ceilings awaiting installation on a second occasion. On the third occasion the pipes were cut out after installation was completed in the ceiling approximately 12 to 15 feet high.

Breaking and Entering to Businesses

On separate occasions three offices in Kernersville were broken into overnight and had equipment stolen. The suspect(s) entered through the back window and used the office trashcans to transport items such as computer equipment, digital cameras, televisions, DVD players, radios and vacuums. On one occasion the suspects even took sodas from the refrigerator. Similar cases have been reported out of Winston-Salem.

Motor Vehicle Theft

On October 6th 2009 the Kernersville Police Department responded to Shamburg Auto Sales located at 410 East Bodenhamer Street, in reference to the larceny of several vehicles. Upon arrival officers determined that the fence had been cut and 4 vehicles were taken. A 2000



Cadillac Deville silver in color, a 1996 Impala SS black in color, a 2007 Honda TRX450-R 4 wheeler black and white in color and a Chevrolet Silverado pick-up truck which was later recovered in Charlotte, North Carolina. A set of 22 inch chrome wheels were also stolen.



Common Law Robbery & Assault With a Deadly Weapon

On June 3rd, 2009 at approximately 2:15 p.m. the victim, a 71 year old female was walking across the parking lot to C&H Cafeteria. A black male driving a small burgundy vehicle drove towards the victim, as he approached her he grabbed her purse and sped off. The victim was pulled to the ground and dragged a short distance due to being tangled in her purse strap. The victim received numerous injuries.

Arson

On October 24th, 2008 the Kernersville Fire Department responded to a house fire on Croyden Drive. Upon arrival they found the house engulfed in flames. It was determined that the fire was intentionally set. The residence was destroyed however there were no injuries. Police Detectives and the Fire Department continue to investigate this case.

Larceny

On June 11th, 2009 the Kernersville Police Department responded to Page and Associates in reference to work trucks being broken into. Surveillance video showed two males breaking into two work trucks parked behind the business. Approximately \$13,000 worth of tools were stolen.
