

# You can recycle your dry-cell batteries at any of these drop-off locations free of charge:

- Public Services Department - 720 McKaughan St
- Fire Station 41 – 316 West Bodenhamer St
- Fire Station 43 - 2050 West Mountain St
- Fire Station 44 – 1528 Teague Ln
- Kernersville Public Library – 130 East Mountain St

Look for the blue collection tubes near the entrance of the buildings!  
Larger dry cell batteries that do not fit in the tubes can be brought to the Public Services Department drop-off location.

## What's a Dry Cell Battery?

a dry cell battery is a sealed battery that doesn't spill or leak its content. Most batteries are dry cell batteries. Below are some examples of dry cell batteries:

### COMMON USES

Cassettes players, radios, appliances
